THE LEIGH LINK A NEW BUS ROUTE

Residents of Leigh and all points north are delighted with the introduction of the new 23A & 23B bus service between Leigh Station and the Airport Business Park.

This vital new connection runs throughout the day, providing reliable transport links for commuters, shoppers and visitors alike.

This has been long fought for by your Lib Dem Councillors over many years and has opened up the opportunity for more non-car access to Leigh as a north/south route which residents have been asking for.

The route supports the local economy of Leigh Broadway and the Old Town, and will hopefully prove attractive to potential stall holders when the Farmers' Market is relaunched.

LEIGH PORT PROGRESS

The Leigh Port redevelopment is moving forward to support our fishing industry, heritage, and tourism.

After delays due to Covid and complex negotiations with the Environment Agency and Marine Management Organisation, work is set to begin with funding extended to March 2028.

This investment will sustain jobs, protect our fishing heritage, and boost tourism for years to come.

PROTECTING OUR GREEN BELT

Many of you expressed concern about the proposals of the Salvation Army for housing on its land in Hadleigh and the effects on Leigh.

There has been some measure of success on this as Castle Point BC has not included the land in its Local Plan.

However, we can never be complacent. There are three scenarios now to consider, given the proposal is not necessarily dead and buried:

1. The Salvation Army can still submit a planning application even though it has no local plan endorsement.



2. The Local Plan could be rejected by the Secretary of State on the basis that it does not meet the required housing provision.

3. The Local Plan is allowed to go forward to its Examination in Public where the Salvation Army put forward a case for the inclusion of the land for housing.

MY PRIORITIES FOR WEST LEIGH

If elected in May 2026, my focus will be:

Protecting the Green Belt Fighting any attempts to build on our precious green spaces.

Improving Local Transport Building on the Leigh Link success with better bus services, safer cycling routes, and improved pedestrian access.

Supporting Local Businesses Ensuring our high streets get the support they need, from

the Farmers' Market relaunch to tackling anti-social behaviour.

Tackling the Bins Challenge Finding solutions for residents who struggle with the bins while encouraging recycling.

Investing in Our Environment Ensuring West Leigh's green spaces like Two Tree Island receive proper investment using RAMS and Community Infrastructure Levy funds.

At the Council meeting on 16 October Cllr Carole Mulroney obtained agreement from the Cabinet member for the environment to a task force being set up to examine the needs of the Island.

For the last 6 or 7 years the City Council has been paying into the Essex Coast RAMS fund. So far Southend has paid in £55,000 but has never

drawn down on this fund.

Two Tree Island is a haven for wildlife and covered by national and local designations.


There have been ongoing problems on the Island with anti-social behaviour, lack of investment and lately, overnight parking.
